THE 46th ANNUAL BLESSED JOHN INGRAM WALK The Annual Blessed John Ingram Walk takes place this year on Sunday 22 July, starting in Newcastle and concluding near the place of his martyrdom on Gateshead High Street. The Walk begins near the site of the prison, where Blessed John Ingram was held, at St Andrew's Anglican Church, Newgate Street, Newcastle. Please gather here for 2.30pm for a short prayer service at 2.45pm. The walk will proceed down through the Big Market and across the Swing Bridge, walking up to Gateshead High Street, and assembling at the site of St Edmund's Chapel (now called Holy Trinity) located at the bottom of Jackson Street. This is the exact location where our Priest Martyr was executed. There we will have an Ecumenical Service, followed by refreshments. If you would like to take part without doing the Walk, please assemble at St Edmund's at 3.30pm. As our Partnership of Gateshead parishes carries his name, we hope more of us will come along to commemorate his sacrifice for the Catholic faith on 26 July 1594 at the age of 29 years.
