In order to grow as a synodal Church it is important that we all have a chance to pray and discern how the Holy Spirit is inviting us to grow in mission in our parishes and communities. To facilitate this I, together with others, offer an initial Diocesan vision for your prayerful reflection. Our discerned Diocesan commitments are: To Walk with Jesus and Enable Others to Encounter Him; To Grow as One Diocesan Family - Rebuilding Relationships; Forming and Developing People for Mission; Living Justly and Caring for Our Common Home. Each of these commitments are developed in the vision. It is not my intention to impose this vision. It is offered for further reflection and I invite all of our parishes and communities to prayerfully reflect on them. We offer accompanying resources and support to enable this reflection.

NEW LECTIONARY FOR MASS AND NEW PEOPLE'S MISSALS On the first Sunday of Advent 1 December 2024, The Lectionary, which is the book that contains the Scripture Readings for Mass and the celebration of the Sacraments, is changing as part of the continuing process of revising liturgical translations, which began with the Roman Missal in 2011.

The new Lectionary will use both the English Standard Version - Catholic Edition (ESV-CE) of the Bible and the Abbey Psalter for the Psalms. The changes are intended to make the biblical translations more faithful to the original languages, which is more proclaimable and, where appropriate, more inclusive. Each parish will need to purchase a new Lectionary, which is divided into four volumes, for each church. This Ambo (Lectern) Edition of the Lectionary costs £695 and will be available in October.

Donor Bookplates - Each Lectionary comes with four insertable bookplates, one for each volume, which can be inscribed with the names of those who may wish to sponsor a volume. Anyone wishing to sponsor a volume may do so at a cost of £174 per volume. There is also a **Book of the Gospels** available to buy, which will complete the set at a cost of £275. Parishioners are invited to consider donating towards this unavoidable cost. **Please contact the Parish Office by Sunday 23 June if you would like to sponsor a volume. Thank you.**

As part of this overall update of Liturgical Resources, there will also be **People's Missals** available for you to buy. Copies of the Sunday Missal are priced at £9.95 (paperback), £19.95 (hardback), £29.95 (bonded leather hardback) and will be available from 24 October. The **People's Daily Missal** (for Weekday Readings) will be available from April 2025. To view these resources please visit <u>www.newlectionary.org</u> or view the brochure available at each church entrance. Advanced orders of these Missals may be made through the Parish (including a discount of 10% if ordered by the end of June). **If you would like to order a People's Missal, please sign up on the lists at the back of each church by Sunday 23 June.**

Liturgy of the Word

Exodus 24:3-8

Moses went and told the people all the commands of the Lord and all the ordinances. In answer, all the people said with one voice, 'We will observe all the commands that the Lord has decreed.' Moses put all the commands of the Lord into writing, and early next morning he built an altar at the foot of the mountain, with twelve standing-stones for the twelve tribes of Israel. Then he directed certain young Israelites to offer holocausts and to immolate bullocks to the Lord as communion sacrifices. Half of the blood Moses took up and put into basins, the other half he cast on the altar. And taking the Book of the Covenant he read it to the listening people, and they said, 'We will observe all that the Lord has decreed; we will obey.' Then Moses took the blood and cast it towards the people. 'This' he said 'is the blood of the Covenant that the Lord has made with you, containing all these rules.'

Second Reading

Hebrews 9:11-15

Now Christ has come, as the high priest of all the blessings which were to come. He has passed through the greater, the more perfect tent, which is better than one made by men's hands because it is not of this created order; and he has entered the sanctuary once and for all, taking with him not the blood of goats and bull calves, but his own blood, having won an eternal redemption for us. The blood of goats and bulls and the ashes of a heifer are sprinkled on those who have incurred defilement and they restore the holiness of their outward lives; how much more effectively the blood of Christ, who offered himself as the perfect sacrifice to God through the eternal Spirit, can purify our inner self from dead actions so that we do our service to the living God. He brings a new covenant, as the mediator, only so that the people who were called to an eternal inheritance may actually receive what was promised: his death took place to cancel the sins that infringed the earlier covenant.

On the first day of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover lamb was sacrificed, his disciples said to Jesus, 'Where do you want us to go and make the preparations for you to eat the Passover?' So he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, 'Go into the city and you will meet a man carrying a pitcher of water. Follow him, and say to the owner of the house which he enters, "The Master says: Where is my dining room in which I can eat the Passover with my disciples?" He will show you a large upper room furnished with couches, all prepared. Make the preparations for us there.' The disciples set out and went to the city and found everything as he had told them, and prepared the Passover. And as they were eating he took some bread, and when he had said the blessing he broke it and gave it to them. 'Take it,' he said 'this is my body.' Then he took a cup, and when he had returned thanks he gave it to them, and all drank from it, and he said to them, 'This is my blood, the blood of the covenant, which is to be poured out for many. I tell you solemnly, I shall not drink any more wine until the day I drink the new wine in the kingdom of God.' After psalms had been sung they left for the Mount of Olives.
