DAY OF PRAYER FOR HUMAN LIFE - SUNDAY 16 JUNE

The Church teaches that life is to be nurtured and respected from conception to natural death. The theme for this year's Day for Life is *The Lord is my Shepherd - Compassion and Hope at the End of Life*. A debate on end-of-life issues has been in the headlines in recent months with calls for assisted suicide being expressed, especially by celebrities, a view that opposes the Catholic view that life is a gift and that we are called to care for others at the end of their lives.

NEW LECTIONARY FOR MASS AND NEW PEOPLE'S MISSALS

On the first Sunday of Advent 1 December 2024, The Lectionary, which is the book that contains the Scripture Readings for Mass and the celebration of the Sacraments, is changing as part of the continuing process of revising liturgical translations, which began with the Roman Missal in 2011.

The new Lectionary will use both the English Standard Version - Catholic Edition (ESV-CE) of the Bible and the Abbey Psalter for the Psalms. The changes are intended to make the biblical translations more faithful to the original languages, more proclaimable and, where appropriate, more inclusive. Each parish will need to purchase a new Lectionary, which is divided into four volumes, for each church. This four volume Ambo (Lectern) Edition of the Lectionary costs £695 and will be available in October.

Donor Bookplates - Each Lectionary comes with four insertable bookplates, one for each volume, which can be inscribed with the names of those who may wish to sponsor a volume. Anyone wishing to sponsor a volume may do so at a cost of £174 per volume. There is also a **Book of the Gospels** available to buy, which will complete the set at a cost of £275. Parishioners are invited to consider donating towards this unavoidable cost. **Please contact the Parish Office by next Sunday 23 June if you would like to sponsor a volume. Thank you.**

People's Missal - As part of this overall update of Liturgical Resources, there will also be People's Sunday Missals available for you to buy. Copies of this Sunday Missal are priced at £9.95 (paperback), £19.95 (hardback), £29.95 (bonded leather hardback) and will be available from October 2024. The People's Daily Missal (for Weekday Readings) will be available from April 2025. To view these resources please visit www.newlectionary.org or view the brochure available at each church entrance. Advanced orders of these Missals may be made through the Parish (including a discount of 10% if ordered by the end of June). Using many parables like these, he spoke the word to them, so far as they were capable of understanding it. He would not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything to his disciples when they were alone.
