PARISH FOOD BANK AND REFUGEE PROJECT UPDATE N.B. We are short of most produce - even if you can only bring along 1 or 2 tins please bring them along to church to help out. Monetary donations are also very much appreciated.

FOOD ITEMS IN SHORT SUPPLY: UHT milk, tinned tuna, meat (corned beef, pek), custard, fruit, cereal, dried pasta, long grained rice, pasta sauce, tomato purée, coffee, teabags, toothpaste, toilet rolls.

OTHER priority items: cooking oil, tomato ketchup, mayonnaise, tinned baked beans, chopped tomatoes, meatballs, hotdogs, rice pudding, carrots, sweetcorn, garden peas, potatoes, soup, gravy granules, biscuits sugar, jam, crisps, spray cleaner, washing up liquid, laundry powder/liquid, shower gel, feminine hygiene (towels & tampons), antiperspirant, shampoo.

Other items we put into the monthly food bags, especially for the Refugee Project: tinned chickpeas & kidney beans.
