

PARISH FOOD BANK AND REFUGEE PROJECT UPDATE N.B. We are short of most produce - even if you can only bring along 1 or 2 tins please bring them along to church to help out. Monetary donations are also very much appreciated.

FOOD ITEMS IN SHORT SUPPLY: UHT milk, , tinned tuna, meat (corned beef, pek), cooking oil, custard, dried pasta, long grained rice, tomato purée, coffee, teabags, toothpaste, laundry powder/liquid, spray cleaner toilet rolls.

**OTHER priority items:** cereal, pasta sauce, tomato ketchup, mayonnaise, tinned baked beans, chopped tomatoes, meatballs, hotdogs, rice pudding, fruit, carrots, sweetcorn, garden peas, potatoes, soup, gravy granules, biscuits sugar, jam, crisps washing up liquid, shower gel, shampoo, feminine hygiene (towels & tampons), antiperspirant.

Other items we put into the monthly food bags, especially for the Refugee Project: tinned chickpeas & kidney beans.

Every Thursday (\*see exception below) volunteers are in Immaculate Heart Church between 9.30am - 10.30am so parishioners can drop off donations then if they wish please come in to say 'Hello' and see what we're up to.
